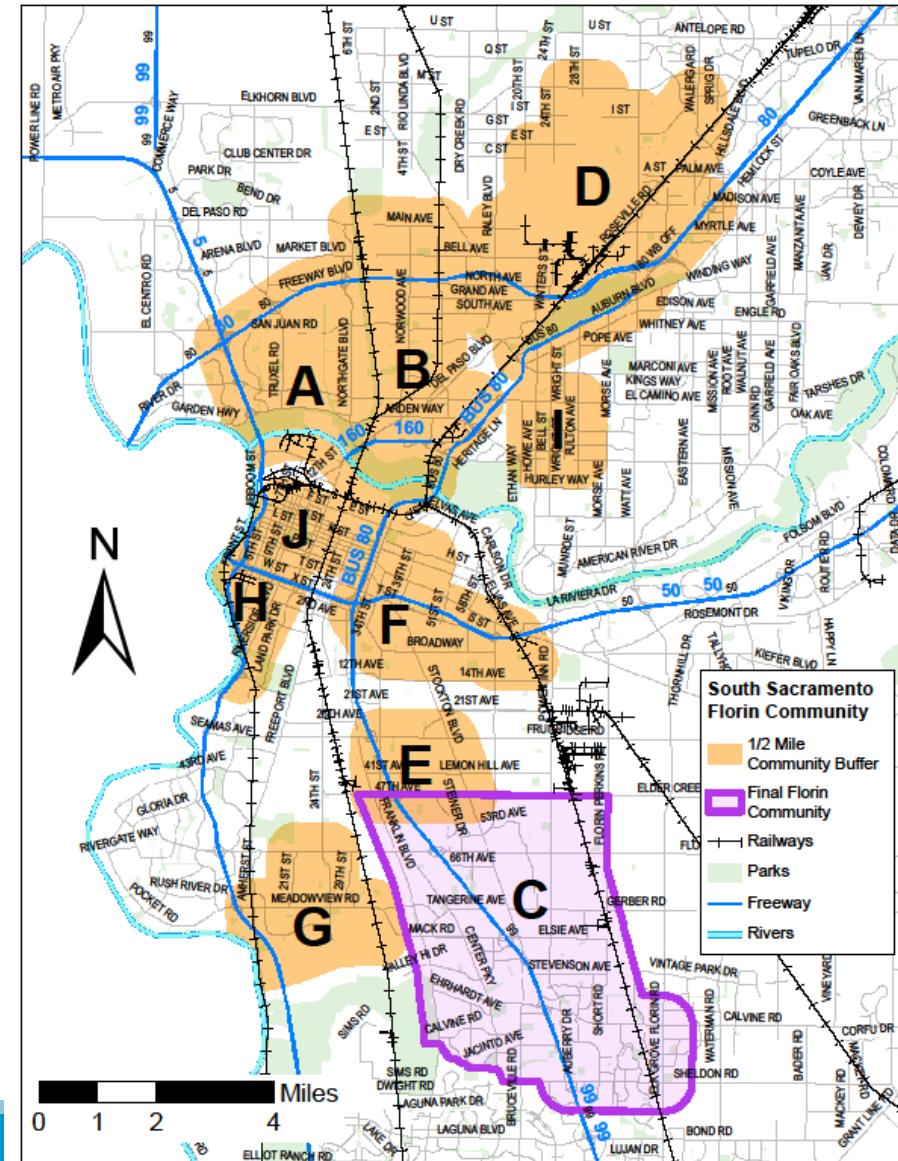

Considerations:

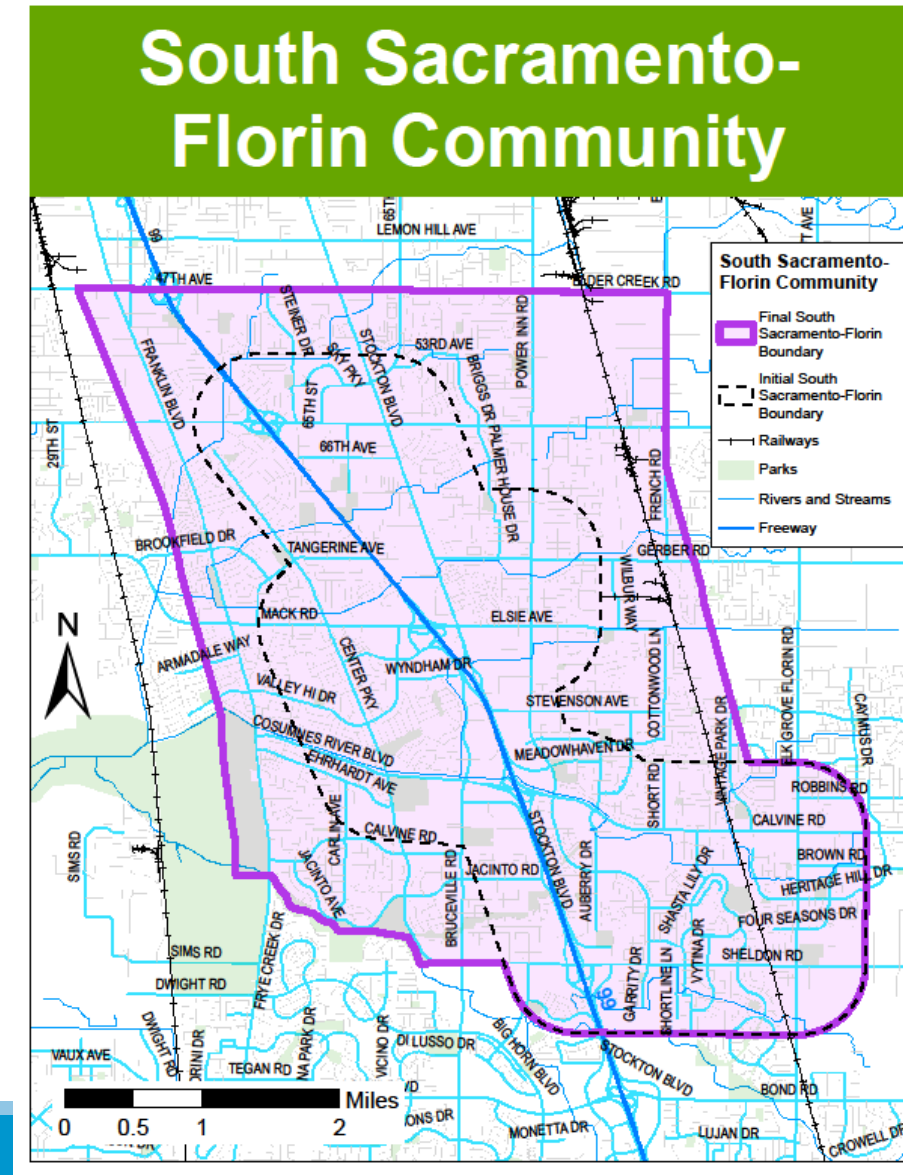
- Comprehensive analysis of multiple pollution impact indicators
- CalEnviroScreen air pollution indicators
- Socio-economic considerations
- Proximity of schools, hospitals, parks to emission sources
- Community Health Needs Assessment
- Toxics screening performed by CARB

South Sacramento-Florin Community

- Final boundary approved by community steering committee
- Includes areas designated as disadvantaged communities
- Major impacts from freeways and major roadways
- Numerous schools, parks and hospitals
- Most significant pollution source – mobile – truck, car, and locomotive emissions
- Impacts from and on businesses



Working with our Community

Objective:

- High community interest
- Robust engagement and feedback from the community at large (residents, businesses, civil society, etc.)
- Provide information to the committee as requested to help inform decisions
- Develop monitoring plans that provides information to inform change
- Achieve tangible emission reductions that directly benefit the community

Challenges:

- Aggressive timelines established in AB617
 - Need for information so District and steering committee can make informed decisions
 - Time to procure and install monitoring equipment
- Ongoing resources
 - Resource commitment required to meet expectations of existing work and meet the expectation of adding additional communities in the future
 - Incentive funding for emission reductions
